- 3. Portland, Maine population: 66,878
- 4. Bloomington, Illinois population: 77,941
- 5. Eau Claire, Wisconsin population: 69,835
- 6. Waukesha, Wisconsin population: 72,483
- 7. Rochester, Minnesota population: 115,733
- 8. Greenville, South Carolina population: 68,223
- 9. Conway, Arkansas population: 65,790
- 10. Cambridge, Massachusetts population: 113,631

To rank the top college towns, Schools.com's experts used the most recent, publicly available government data and analyzed the information using factors like cost of living, commute options, student population, and crime and unemployment rates.
