







Are you considering attending one of the many accredited healthcare schools in <u>New York</u>? That could be a smart choice, as the <u>healthcare industry</u> has seen consistent growth in recent years across the country, and New York is no exception.

In 2017, New York ranked third in the country for healthcare employment, accounting for 7.2 percent of the total nationwide healthcare workforce. Further, as of March 2019, New York City alone saw a gain of 45,200 jobs in the education and healthcare sector over a one-year period — the most of any sector measured. Because of this record job growth, healthcare workers in New York have been able to find numerous opportunities in different areas of the field, from nursing to medical assisting, from gerontology to physical therapy, from medical billing and coding to healthcare technology.

In addition to the job security offered by such explosive growth, healthcare workers in New York may also be able to expect a competitive salary. The average pay for community health workers in the state, for example, is over \$45,000 a year — about four percent higher than the national average.

3 Facts about Healthcare in New York

Besides the Empire State's growth in healthcare employment opportunities, there are other important factors to be aware of when considering attending online healthcare programs in New York, including that:

• New York is the sixth-most expensive state for personal healthcare spending. Healthcare expenditures in New York make up about 7.8 percent of the United States' total healthcare expenditures. That amounts to over \$8,000 per person over the state's population of 19.4 million people.

- New York is known for having some of the best healthcare systems and healthcare colleges in the country. Mount Sinai Hospital, for example, staffs over 42,000 employees across eight hospital campuses, including the highly regarded Icahn School of Medicine.
- Between 2000 and 2017, over 140,000 home healthcare jobs were added in the state, nearly tripling within that 17-year period. Though hospitals in the state still employ more healthcare workers, home health and ambulatory services represent one of the greatest areas of growth in New York healthcare careers.

Best Healthcare Careers in New York

While the actual responsibilities of different healthcare-related occupations may be similar from state to state, New York has several unique qualities and situations that bring about greater need and demand for certain occupations.

For example, there are over 50,000 medical assistants in New York. Why is it such a popular career choice? Because, unlike in many other states, medical assistants in New York do not need to be licensed in order to work in the role.

New York is also home to more physician assistants than anywhere else in the country. Besides the demand driven by the state's large population, its higher costs of living also contribute to physician assistants in New York earning an average of \$5,000 more than the national average for the position.

How to Pick a Healthcare Major That's Best for You

Because the healthcare industry has such a wide variety of jobs, it's usually possible for healthcare professionals to focus on a career that fits their passions, interests and/or personality. Picking the right healthcare major can be easier if you consider it from this angle.

For example, if you love interacting with people and want to be involved in hands-on treatment with patients, you might consider becoming a <u>registered nurse</u>. Alternately, if you prefer more "behind-the-scenes" work and you're more office-oriented, healthcare can still work for you: you could become a <u>medical biller or coder</u>. And if you're a person who enjoys learning and wants to dive deeper into your education, you may be interested in a specialized field like <u>radiology</u> or <u>clinical laboratory science</u>.

Whether you'd enjoy working in a calmer environment as a massage therapist in Rochester, or you'd prefer thinking on your feet as an emergency nurse in Brooklyn, think about the things you enjoy doing before deciding which healthcare major is right for you.

Best Online Healthcare Schools in New York

Our list of the best healthcare colleges in New York is determined by several different factors. Firstly, we only considered accredited New York colleges for our list. Secondly, in order to be considered one of the best online healthcare programs in New York, each school must offer either a degree or certificate program in the healthcare field, either 100 percent online or as a hybrid option. Finally, the schools were compared using various data points from the Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS).

These online healthcare programs in New York are designed to give you the tools and resources you need for a long, successful career in the healthcare industry.

1. New York University

New York University is a privately-owned, nonprofit university with online degree programs that focus on both the intellectual and the administrative sides of healthcare. Students can pursue online master's degrees in public health, health administration or bioinformatics. Alternately, students interested in a more focused path of healthcare study may consider one of NYU's online certificate programs in public health, applied global public health, hiptogramsites, or health and live to health and live t

NYU uses their own private learning portal, NYU Classes, to conduct learning management for both online classes and hybrid classes. Hybrid classes are an option of particular interest in the public health degree program, whice allows students to take online electives while they split face-to-face studies between Washington, D.C. and an international location.

2. SUNY Canton

SUNY College of Technology at Canton actually tops our list of the best online colleges in New York, so it's no wonder that the school has achieved a distinction as one of the best healthcare colleges in New York as well.

SUNY uses the Blackboard system to keep its online students connected to assignments and other coursework. One of the best online healthcare programs at SUNY is the 2+2 nursing program, designed specifically for nursing students who already have an associate's degree. This program can help nurses advance their careers and potentially earn positions in higher-level healthcare facilities. It is designed to allow RNs to earn their degrees efficiently on their own time, as many of its students are already working as nurses and thus have busy schedules.

Another online healthcare degree program offered at SUNY Canton is the online B.S. in healthcare management, which is accredited by the International Accreditation Council for Business Education (IACBE). Students who are interested in helping animals instead of people may instead consider the school's 2+2 program in veterinary service administration.

3. Hudson Valley Community College

Online medical students at Hudson Valley Community College have a plethora of options to choose from. First and foremost, if you're looking for a career in dentistry, you can enroll in the online dental assistant certification program, which satisfies the New York State requirements to become a Licensed Registered Dental Assistant (LRDA).

This program is typically completed in one year, but it is only available for enrollment in the fall. It consists of 27 hours of online coursework, combined with 225 hours of clinical experience via internship. Because the course only takes a year to complete, it's a great way to quickly earn hands-on experience in dentistry and start working with patients. There is also an online, non-credit alternative dental assisting program, specially designed for students currently working in the field who have more than 3,500 hours of work experience and CPR certification.

Other online healthcare options at HVCC include programs in exercise science (A.S.), health information management and technology (A.A.S.), health sciences (certificate), worksite health promotion (certificate) and fitness specialist (certificate).

4. The Sage Colleges

Together, the Sage Colleges offer a graduate-level dietetic internship certification program that includes three online practicum classes. The program is offered each semester, and it is accredited through the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics. If your interest is in preventative healthcare and nutrition, this can be one of the best healthcare colleges in New York for gaining the necessary education and experience for the field, and the online components give it much-appreciated flexibility.

Students who complete this internship are automatically accepted into the M.S. in applied nutrition degree program at the Sage Colleges. The 30-credit program (21 credits for those who have successfully completed the Dietetics internship) can be completed on a full-time or part-time basis. It is available fully online for students who either:

- Hold a B.S. degree in nutrition or a closely-related field with graduate credits
- Are already registered dietitians with graduate credits
- Have completed the internship program

The Sage Colleges also offer an online M.S. in healthcare administration — accredited by the International Assembly for Collegiate Business Education (IACBE) — to those whose healthcare interests are more administrative than hands on in pature

5. Canisius College

Not only is Canisius College number four on our list of best online colleges in New York, but it's also one of the best online healthcare schools in New York too.

One program of interest at Canisius is the M.S. in respiratory care, which is delivered entirely through the Desire2Learn (D2L) learning management system. The program itself is made up of seven core courses that enrolled students must take. In addition, it features four specialty track courses students can choose from through which they can study topics such as respiratory therapeutics or respiratory care education.

Other online healthcare programs New York students can benefit from at Canisius include a master's in applied nutrition (which does not qualify students to sit the RD examination upon completion) and a master's in community & school health. The school's programs operate on eight-week terms, and admission is available for fall, spring and summer semesters.

6. University of Buffalo

The University of Buffalo comes in at No.5 on our list of best online colleges in New York. Among its various online and hybrid offerings are several healthcare-centric programs, which has also earned the university the No.6 place on this list. The School of Public Health at IIB, for example, offers two online programs.

- The advanced certificate in public health
- The online individualized Master of Public Health (MPH)

The advanced certificate in public health requires 16 credit hours that can be completed solely online. These credits can then be used toward the online individualized MPH program. Both programs are accredited by the Council on Education in Public Health and are hosted by UB's online learning application program: UBLearns, which allows students to complete coursework online while also facilitating interactions with professors and other students through message boards.

7. Mercy College

In addition to earning a place on our list of top schools in the state, Mercy College is one of the best accredited healthcare schools in New York for professionals who are already in the healthcare industry and looking to advance their careers. One option, the school's RN-BS degree completion program, enables students who are currently working as registered nurses to earn their bachelor's degree in nursing, rather than completing a certificate from a diploma program.

Other programs available at Mercy include online bachelor's programs in community health, gerontology, and health services management, as well as online master's programs in health services management (MPA), health services management (MS), nursing administration, and nursing education. An 18-credit residency is required for completion of the bachelor's programs, while health services management (MPA and MS) require on-site class attendance and the nursing administration program involves a 120-hour practicum. The nursing education program can be completed entirely online.

Students at Mercy receive ample support for their online courses, including library workshops, test preparation and other resources. Students can complete the programs on a per-semester basis, enrolling online in the fall, spring or summer semesters.
